And for August: Hot August Nights? Maybe; Global warming?, what warming; Record heat?-record cold?; Low lake levels?-not. My Crepe Myrtles haven't even blossomed yet, so when does the snow start. No- we're not in Kansas anymore! What a great summer for sailing so far. I brought out the jacket to work outdoors in the morning this week, and checked out the winter weather, in Martinez this week. Foggy, C-C- C- Cold; 9 deg Celsius-(about 52 deg F) with whitecaps everywhere and wind at 20 plus with gust into the 30's. No wonder the delta breeze has been blowing. Kind of makes me want to break out the 20 foot Cat and go really fast like at Union Valley Reservoir last year. Those that took a ride with me got to experience 20+ knots boat speed, but hey! We're going to do it again.

This month is the annual shooting star-camp & cruise trip to union valley reservoir. The best viewing for the Persied showers this year is the 12th of august but that is on a Thursday so we will be meeting on the 13th thru the 15th. This is one place I really like to talk up, with dependable winds from 10 AM to 5 PM, trees down to the waterline, land of sky blue waters, 4900 feet elevation with dark skies at night and no moon this year to reduce visibility, and its close-95 miles from Watt & Hwy 50.

Friday. Those camping on boats don't face any of these issues, but for the land campers there is usually an opportunity to camp in the launch parking lot if you are self-contained, i.e. have a potty. This will be the fall back option as we expect to get a site or two where all can meet, eat and party.

Once again the August meeting is back at the library in Fair Oaks on Thursday the 13th @ 7:00 and the presenters are Chris & Robyn Parker, with the subject being their trip through the inside passage in Alaska; it should be beautiful and contain several good stories of the adventure. At this writing we still need a cruise captain for both the Star cruise and the labor day cruise. Volunteers?

How to Eat Well While Cruising

FIESTA GUACAMOLE

From: Assemblyman Bill Landcaster, "California Poppycoctions Cook Book, Sacramento Cerebral Palsy guild, 1977.

INGREDIENTS:

6 large avocados
6 TBS lemon juice
2 tsp. salt*
½ tsp. garlic powder
1 TBS finely grated onion
1/3 tsp. cayenne pepper
1 TBS Worcestershire Sauce
1 cup grated Cheddar cheese
1 cup grated jack cheese
1 ½ small cans chopped olives
1 Large purple onion, chopped *
3 medium tomatoes, diced

DIRECTIONS:

Combine first seven ingredients and mash smoothly. Spread in 14 inch round plate. Place layer of chopped olives on this, then layer of jack cheese, layer of chopped onion, layer of diced tomatoes, layer of Cheddar cheese. Serve with taco chips as a dip.

Tester's note: *We preferred to use only 1 tsp. of salt and 1/4 onion; it looked beautiful and tasted terrific.

So named because just like Benedict Arnold, traitor to the county, leaving out the meat on an Eggs Benedict recipe is like being a traitor to the meat eaters.

EGGS: hardboiled and shelled
Toasted bread or English muffins
Sliced tomatoes or avocado, or both
Slices of cheese to match eggs (I use Smokey Gouda) Hollandaise sauce from package. (I use MPK FOODS package and only mix it with water, no milk or butter)
Assemble: bread, tomato, cheese, eggs, topped all with Hollandaise

A nice way to serve bananas: Cut in half, Peel skin off so that there is a bottom to the half-banana and the top is revealed. Squirt with limejuice, sprinkle with nutmeg, cut into edible size pieces, and eat.

It's not too late, just fill out your renewal and send in your dues.

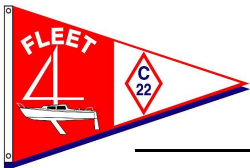

Boat Camping at Folsom Lake

On board camping is allowed on vessels that have a self-contained sanitary unit.

A self contained sanitary unit must be Coast Guard approve, have a holding tank that has a tight and perfect closure at all times, and is installed in a location that affords complete privacy for it's user. Waste must be dumped at an appropriate onshore facility. The vessel must also have proper sleeping accommodations for all persons on board.

All boat campers must register at either the Granite Bay entrance station or the main office building at Folsom Lake Marina, located in Brown's Ravine. Boats will be inspected to verify that it meets all regulations. A boat camping registration box is located at the front door of the marina and may be used to register for boat camping, when the marina office is closed.

On board boat camping is allowed only in the following areas:

South Fork...Deep Ravine to Higgins Point

North Fork...Bear Cove to Mormon Ravine

Brown's Ravine...Slip renters at the marina are allowed to camp on their boats in their slips overnight, however, they must register to do so.

Offshore boat campers must follow all the laws and regulations of the State of California and the Department of Parks and Recreation, including the following:

1. All boats must be moored and remain moored during all hours the park is officially closed. *Boating after the official closing hour is prohibited.*
2. Boats must be moored out of the main traffic channels and within 200 feet of shore. Camping is prohibited on shore.
3. Boat campers may not be tied to or pulled up on shore while boat camping.
4. All boats must display an anchor light in accordance with California's Administrative code.
5. It is unlawful to operate a boat while under the influence of alcohol and/or certain drugs.
6. Boat camping is limited to a maximum of two consecutive nights.
7. Fires are NOT permitted on shore at anytime.
8. Vehicles must be registered at the area in which the vehicles are located. A vehicle parked in Granite Bay cannot register at Brown's Ravine for boat camping.
9. Any vehicle in the park after closing and not registered to boat camp is subject to a citation from the Park Rangers for none payment of fees.
