

► RACING ROUNDUP <

Boy-o-Boy did I get it wrong regarding the weather trends in my last report! By this time, we all know that the flood is yet to come, so let's pray for a cold spring to prevent the deluge from hitting us all at once.

Folsom Lake is filling fast since the threat of more rain is postponed and the release gates are shut. There are some normal gate releases plus usual energy production happening, giving 9,000 cubic feet per second releases, but the inflow is raising the lake 1,000 acre-feet per day. Were at 431 feet elevation (approx.) 60% full at this writing. 460 feet is full.

Picked up the boat this last week for its annual spring cleaning prior to the **Camellia Cup scheduled on April 22-23**. This is the 56th year of the regatta and will be my 27th trip around the buoys. 18 years with the Catalina 22 and the rest on an 18' Hobie Cat. I even met my wife - of thirty years - on the FLYC Committee boat in 1989 when I was running a regatta for 240 Hobie Cats. Anyway, the Cam Cup is usually a good experience - but never the same experience.

Oh the stories - no wind-40 mph wind, rain, quarter sized hail + 40 mph downdrafts, winds from 2 directions, shifts of 180 degrees at the start line, missing marks, drifting marks, 30 centerboard boats all abandoned and floating belly up with the skippers all on the beach, 15 Catamarans tipped over on the beach of the peninsula with crews huddled beneath the sails for protection from hail. WEATHER HAPPENS! This spring has been breezy, so - "I predict a drifter" - just kidding as my last guess was pretty bad.

Don't forget the following Saturday the 29th of April the Trans-Folsom Pursuit Race is happening, also at Browns Ravine. This race lets the slowest boats start first according to their handicap with the intent that all things being equal, everybody finishes at the same time. The race is frequently shortened due to light winds, but the full course is about 22 miles in length with trips to the Dam and up both forks of the lake. This event will test your skills - strategy, perseverance, conditioning, and navigation.

Remember racing is usually fun and most importantly makes you a better sailor!!
