▶ RACING ROUNDUP <</p>

OK frost biters, it finally got cold – time to go to the Bay Area for your race/sailing fix. An alternative is going to YouTube and watching the preliminary rounds of the 2024 Americas Cup with the finals being held in Barcelona Spain later next year. One prelim has been contested already in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia.

The prelims are being sailed on 40' boats with a crew of 5, but the finals were initially proposed as being 75' with a crew of 11. There are plans afoot to reduce the crew to 8 and allow pedaling, instead of hand cranking on what look like windlasses, but are just hydraulic pump handles that charge storage containers (on a submarine they are called accumulators) that have a gas in the top of the bottle pressurizing the liquid below. There is usually a piston separating the fluid and the gas so it can be horizontal or work in changing attitudes (heaving or rolling). The 40-foot boats can be seen here:

There is a separate league called SAILGP that is still sailing 50-foot foiling catamarans with mixed nationality crews representing various countries. Usually, Aussies or Kiwis as skippers.

There are many racing videos available on YouTube, plus some mean collisions between boats where the rules are not complied with, ignored, or explained to the viewer, which make them useless to the unlearned but exciting otherwise.

Stadium sailing is here to stay as it can be shared through media – unlike long distance races where there is an interesting multi-boat start but winners and stragglers finishing in the middle of the night making poor live entertainment. Back to frost bite sailing – I heard of a good rule of thumb that says if the total of the water temp and the air temperature is under 120 degrees, then one should wear a wet or dry suit. At my age make those 140 degrees. Back in 1975 while in the best shape of my life, being paid to scuba dive in Hawaii, one bottle of air at 40 feet would give us hypothermia if diving without wet suits. Even with shorties we would shake for a half hour after 1 bottle. Using a HOOKA (warm compressed air) system, one could stay in the same water for over an hour and not shake when you get out.

Latest research shows that the shock of the cold water can incapacitate the motor reflexes for breathing and cause gasping even when your head is under water or to spasm that constrict the esophagus causing suffocation. Usually the person comes up once, and unable to breathe is lost to the deep. Being prepared and wearing PFDs is the only thing that can keep you alive.

Locally, one of our Fleet Four members (Gary Preston) won the keelboat division (Hunter 26) of the Governor's Cup hosted by Folsom Lake Yacht Club. This was a series of 1-day races over 5 weeks during late August and all of September.

The centerboard division was won by John Poimiroo (who edits the FLYC newsletter) sailing a 14-foot Lido. John proved the old adage, that being there was half of the victory, saying that "we are there for fun, but showing up helped." He also paused to train some "new to racing" sailors, eventually losing a race to one of the newbies (pronounced new bees).

Fleet general membership meeting this Thursday – be there at the pizza place on Madison near Greenback – Round Table.
