► RACING ROUNDUP <</p>

My last report mentioned potential water levels for 2033. Put that one to bed, as the snowpack looks pretty good, but the pattern seems like the past; the early storms then nothing. There is some rain coming later this week, but I still don't like the pattern.

The local lake will have enough water (watch out for driftwood) for the Camellia Cup coming up April 22nd & 23rd, 2023. This event is the biggest annual event for local racing sailors and gets boats from northern California, Nevada, and the Pacific Northwest on occasion.

April 29th, 2023 will be the occasion of the Trans-Folsom race. This event may (wind depending) give the grand tour of Folsom Lake, with a start time that depends on your boat's handicap, with the slowest starting first in a reverse pursuit format. The idea is that everything being equal, all boats will finish at the same time.

Potentially this race is around 22 miles and can take all day with excursions up the North Fork, back to the middle near the dam, then up the South Fork, and returning to the marina for the finish. The fastest time is somewhere near 3 hours with a 25-orso-foot-trimaran; however multihulls are not included anymore. The long downwind sections favor spinnaker boats, but the C22 can lead for a majority of the race if the winds are strong early and lighten during the middle of the day. This event will test your navigation skills: marks can be difficult to locate, or can be confused. On days with lighter wind the course is usually shortened so everybody is off the water before dark. Be prepared for anything - rain, hail, winds over 40 mph, blistering sun, no wind, shifts, and mostly fun!

Join us in the races - it makes you a better sailor. These 3 race days count toward the C22 Fleet 4 racing title.

Fleet 4 Officers' Meeting 19 January 2023

The meeting convened at 7:38pm; Captain Kevin Clancy presiding. We had a quorum.

Madeline Rayfuse reported on the progress of finding a venue for our annual banquet. Rio City Cafe on Front Street charges \$5 – \$7 per person for a room, and we (apparently) order off their menu. She's playing phone-tag with Cattleman's; she will continue with them. Susan Patchett will work with Lucille's Smokehouse Bar-B-Que on Lonetree Blvd. in Rocklin. After discussion, we decided on March 25 as the banquet date, but this depends on what restaurants can do for us. [Note: the decision is Lucille's on March 25th.] The question: we have 21 members; will people stay away because of the price? Last year, we only charged \$10 because the Fleet had extra cash.

Gary Preston presented the 2022 fiscal experience and a budget for this year. The Fleet began 2022 with \$6,972 and ended with \$6,205. Mission accomplished. The 2023 budget was approved unanimously. Details were emailed to each officer.

Officers were advised that (our) dues are past due.

We reviewed the trophies to be awarded at the banquet. Most officers were winning trophies year after year, and getting a bit tired of it. We tabled a decision to scale back (2nd place trophy), drop some, or drop all.

The first cruise will be on Folsom Lake March 11 if the lake is open and the floating debris situation is safe enough.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00pm.

Here are the Fleet 4 financials for 2022. The Board approved a one-time deficit budget to cover most of the cost of our combined banquet and picnic to celebrate the fleet's 50th anniversary. The funding for this deficit was the Retained Earnings from 2021 Net Income. Therefore, there was a Net Loss in 2022 of -\$657, with Total Revenue of \$1,546, and Total Expenses of \$2,204.

The Net Income from 2021 was \$686, offsetting the Net Loss in 2022 of -\$657. The budget for 2023 is a more normal balanced budget, with a zero net income, as expected for a non-profit organization.
