The First of Spring Cruise was postponed two weeks due to inclement weather, so you have a second chance to get your boats wet and experience Spring sailing conditions at Folsom Lake! The rescheduled cruise will be the weekend of Saturday April 6 to Sunday April 7th. I have a scheduling conflict with another event on Saturday, and will not be staying overnight, and will not be able to conduct a Skipper's meeting. So, if anyone else wants to lead this cruise and plan a raft-up in the Marina Basin or New York Cove, please feel free to do so.

The Monterey Whale Watch Cruise in February was rained out, so a substitute event was put on - a dinner at a local restaurant. I've heard that a nice time was had by Fleet 4 Skippers Bill Martin, Monte Whitefield, Kelly Wilson, Kevin Clancy, Roy Moore, Gary Preston, and their crews.

The next scheduled cruise is set for May 25-27, our annual Memorial Weekend Cruise. The location is probably going to be Folsom Lake, unless someone wants to lead an Away cruise. Cruise Leader TBD; I'll lead it unless someone else wants to.

As of this writing (March 29th), Folsom Lake pond elevation stands at 437.77 feet, slowly rising. There should be enough snowpack to allow the lake to get to full pond, typically somewhere between 462~466 feet depending on the whims of the Bureau of Reclamation and the weather in late spring. I'm hoping for a long boating season again this year, at least to mid-October if we are lucky.

Later this summer, probably in July, there has been some talk about a cruise to the San Juan and Gulf Islands. The last time Fleet 4 organized a cruise there was in 2010, 14 years ago, so maybe it's time to try this again. Please email to lgcharlot@gmail.com if you would be interested in participating in or leading this cruise. The usual logistics for trailering your boat for a cruise in the San Juan and Gulf Islands:

1. It's about 900 miles from Sacramento to Bellingham, WA, and it takes 2 days each way.

- 2. Rig up and launch at the ramp at Squalicum Marina in Bellingham.
- 3. Spend the first night at the marina, then depart the next morning.
- 4. The places that Fleet 4 cruisers most often stop at based on past history are: Fossil Bay on Sucia Island; Roche Harbor and Friday Harbor on San Juan Island; Eastsound or Rosario, and Deer Harbor, all on Orcas Island; Prevost Harbor or Reid Harbor on Stuart Island; Sidney Marina on Vancouver Island; Ganges Harbor on Saltspring Island; Montague Harbor on Galiano Island; and Otter Bay Marina on North Pender Island. There are a couple of different ways to plan routes, but one of the main attractions of this cruise is to be sure to reach Sidney Harbor Marina by Wednesday afternoon, so as to have Thursday to visit the weekly Street Market in the town, which is just a 10-minute walk from the Marina. The stopover in Sidney is usually at least 2 or 3 nights, with Friday set aside for a day trip by bus to Victoria or Butchart Garden.
- 5. The cruise wraps up on the 14th day back to Bellingham, and we head home.

If there is enough interest, we should have a Member's Meeting to discuss plans, and for those who have been there to share stories.
